Derbyshire is set to host a state-of-the-art waste treatment facility. Derbyshire County Council and Derby City Council have named Resource Recovery Solutions (Derbyshire) Ltd (RRS) - a joint venture between United Utilities and Interserve - as the preferred contractor for its joint long-term waste management contract.

The 27-year contract includes a waste treatment facility, transfer stations, household waste recycling centres and associated road haulage. £500 million will be invested by RRS. The waste treatment facility will handle 190,000 tonnes of waste and generate enough electricity to power 14,000 homes.

The delivery partner for managing the household waste recycling centres, waste transfer and road haulage is H W Martin Waste Ltd. The company already manages six of the county's eight household waste recycling centres. This new contract will see H W Martin using its experience and expertise in managing household waste recycling centres at the remaining two, including Derby City's Raynesway household waste recycling centre.

H W Martin to build fuel-from-waste facility

H W Martin will soon be adding more to its portfolio of recycling services. The latest output from the company's research and development programme will be the commissioning of a Refuse Derived Fuel (RDF) facility at the waste transfer operation in Northamptonshire. Each year our new RDF plant will transform 50,000

tonnes of waste into high calorific value RDF for use as a fuel in industry.

Residual waste is what remains after recyclable materials have been removed by conventional methods. This residue is usually disposed of at landfill sites, which have a highly negative environmental impact.

H W Martin is investing £2 million into its RDF plant, which will convert almost all of the residual waste passing through it into fuel. With a recently

secured agreement from a blue-chip corporation to use the RDF in place of fossil-fuels, we will not only reduce the pressure on the UK's natural landscape but also enable the reduction of over 66,000 tonnes of CO2 emissions.

In conjunction with our other activities we can reduce the amount of waste sent to landfill from an entire waste stream to an average of just 2.5%. Our objective to become a "zero waste to landfill" company is very close to being achieved.

Businesses in Warwick, Leamington and Wellesbourne are seeing the green shoots of recovery

Local companies are taking up the opportunity to recover and recycle their waste, at the same time saving money on their monthly bin costs. Warwickshire County Council is backing a new business service being provided by H W Martin Waste Ltd. Martin's has been managing the county's local household waste recycling centres for more than two years. Martin's distinctive logo will be seen a lot more as their green recycling vehicles visit business premises across the county.

Martin's recycling service has been designed to be cost-effective and easy to use. Recyclable materials can be placed in pre-paid sacks (from a roll of 20 upwards), they can be wrapped together with pre-paid Martin tape, or for larger amounts there are a range of wheeled bins available in sizes right up to "industrial" size. All materials can be collected and they can be mixed together or separated out. Separating the materials before collection reduces the price to the business.

Although the service is relatively new, Martin's continue to expand the area it serves. There are many satisfied customers too. Tania Wall at Leamington-based Palmer Hargreaves Wallis Tomlinson commented: "Not only are we saving money but HW Martin have also offered a lot of support in finding the right recycling solution for us."
